The N2 Gateway Project started in 2005 and phase one is nearing completion. It is a project of the National Department of Human Settlements. Phase one will deliver about 15 000 houses. KEY FACTS

- Western Cape Department of Human Settlements is the developer
- Ibuyile is the turnkey contractor
- The Housing Development Agency (HDA) is the project manager
- The project will deliver 1 849 houses

PROGRESS TO DATE

- **House construction**
The first handovers were done in December 2010. Construction of the remaining houses is currently underway and progressing well. 625 houses were handed over between December 2010 and September 2011.
- **Beneficiaries**
Beneficiaries will come from informal settlements in Nyanga, Malawi Camp and Freedom Farm, as well as backyarders.
- **Electricity supply**
Eskom started construction on 8 August 2011 to address the inadequate capacity. Regular meetings take place with

community leaders to update the community on progress. 250 units will receive electricity and from there on batches of 100 units for the duration of the project.

- **Waste management**

Waste management is a concern in the area and discussions with City of Cape Town to address the situation are underway.
